- The needs of all people are met in a fair and equitable manner
- All people equally participate in making the decisions that affect them
- The interconnected web of life is acknowledged and celebrated in diverse ways and communities
- Human societies are designed and organized for sustainable existence

Mission Statement

WILPF members create the peaceful transformation they wish to see in the world by making connections that:

- Provide continuity with the past so that knowledge of historical events and patterns informs current activities for change
- Create analysis and action that reflect and reinforce each other
- Link and challenge root causes of oppression, especially racism, sexism, heterosexism, militarism, economic disparity, and political disempowerment
- Build and strengthen relationships and movements for justice, peace, and radical democracy

This year the WILPF Triangle Branch is launching a pilot program of mini-grants to members of the Triangle community to support their efforts for peace and freedom.

- Grants will range from \$100-300
- Applications can be from individuals or groups
- Funds can supplement existing programs and projects or create new initiatives
- *Funds can be used for one-time activities, including trainings or conference attendance*

Successful applicants will be asked to submit a report on how the funds were used within a month after they have been spent, to be a guest on the WILPF Wake-up Call Radio Hour on WCOM 103.5FM, to agree to be videotaped during the radio show for broadcasting on WILPF's program on The Peoples Channel, and to write a short article for the quarterly WILPF newsletter.

This program is being launched with an initial \$1,000. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis from September 2016 through August 2017, or until funds run out.
